

Alcohol and Drug Abuse Services
Monroe County Department of Human Services

The Monroe County Department of Human Services is a State Certified Outpatient AODA and Mental Health clinic providing a variety of services in the area of alcohol and drug abuse assessment, education, and treatment to the residents of Monroe County. These services include:

ASSESSMENTS

- Court Ordered for Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated or other court ordered conditions
- Required by the Department of Corrections
- Recommended by hospitals and other medical professionals
- Individuals voluntarily seeking assistance for an alcohol or drug problem

EMERGENCY SERVICES

- The Department provides certified alcohol and drug abuse counselors to assist families in filing petitions for commitment to treatment for loved ones whose addiction has progressed to the point where they are a danger to themselves and/or others; and can no longer assist themselves without outside intervention.
- The Department contracts with Mayo Clinic Health System and Gundersen Lutheran in La Crosse, WI, as well as other facilities, to provide emergency detoxification services.

ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE TREATMENT

Following a thorough alcohol and drug abuse assessment, a treatment plan specific to each individual's need is developed. Treatment services may include:

- **Medically Monitored (Residential) Treatment** – this most intensive level of treatment is contracted for with Mayo Clinic Health System and Gundersen Lutheran in La Crosse, WI. This level of treatment allows patients to live in a safe, structured, and supportive environment while they gain an understanding of their addiction and develop healthy recovery skills to return to their home and continue their recovery. Treatment is provided 7 days/week and includes family programming.
- **Transitional (Halfway House) Programming** – the Department contracts with Mayo Clinic Health System, Gundersen Lutheran, and occasionally other providers. These programs provide a safe, structured, and supportive living environment that allows the patient to receive continued therapy for their addiction while they begin to integrate back into their home, work, and community environments.
- **Outpatient Treatment** – is provided in individual and/or group settings on a limited basis within the department or can be contracted for in the community through Mayo Clinic Health System and Gundersen Lutheran if funding is available.

Referral Source

The Department serves as a community resource agency, providing Monroe County residents with information regarding alcohol and drug abuse treatment services for both the patient and their families. This may include services in the private and public sector, as well as self-help programming such as AA, NA, Alanon, and Alateen. We also provide educational information to community organizations, when requested.

Intoxicated Driver Assessments and all Court Ordered Assessments require full payment of assessment fee BEFORE an appointment will be scheduled.

Voluntary AODA Assessment Fee is based on a sliding fee scale according to income.

Health insurance that covers the cost of assessment and/or outpatient counseling services will be billed by the department to the insurance company. The Department of Human Services is not a member of any HMO or PPO. If you have an HMO or PPO you will be encouraged to seek services through your insurance provider. Patient's responsibility for payment, after insurance, is based on a sliding fee scale according to income.

Patients who do not have health insurance are billed on a sliding fee scale according to income.
