History of corner establishment since Original Government Survey

There is nothing on record for this corner since the original government survey. However, unrecorded survey data in my possession would indicate that Fred Holden was at this corner during the earlier part of this century.

Description of corner evidence found:


After surveying out Sections 20 and 21, I found that this occupied corner fits very well, and as such I accepted the occupied corner as the best available evidence of the original government corner. I searched a great deal for any other evidence of the corner and witness points but found none. The corner is 15" South of a 14" white oak with wire growing through it. I could not set a Harrison because of tree roots.



