History of corner establishment since Original Government Survey



Fred Holden re-established this corner in August of 1911 and set a stone. The McCoy boundary notes during WWII indicate that a monument was probably set at this corner. In December of 1971 Duane Marten found a McCoy monument at the occupied corner. Denzine used this monument in March of 1976. I used it as a tie in November of 1976. Parish also used the McCoy monument in September of 1981.

I found Holden's stone 1.8' North of the McCoy marker. The stone is the actual corner. Apparently no one had looked for the stone previously. The McCoy marker is now a witness point.


