

*Flood Resilience – A Watershed Approach*




The Monroe County Climate Change Task Force (MCCCTF) was created in September 2019 to address regional flooding issues. One of the primary goals of this initiative is to implement precipitation and stream level "real-time" monitoring stations to serve as a flood warning system established in cooperation with the National Weather Service and Local Emergency Management Coordinators.

The monitoring stations will improve regional flood resilience by providing precipitation and stream level data that will inform the public of potential or active flooding events.




**Flood Resilience** is the ability of a community within a watershed to plan and act collectively, using local capacities to mitigate, prepare for, respond to, and recover from a flood.

**Upper Kickapoo Watershed - Potential Monitoring Sites**



*Establishing a monitoring system in the Upper Kickapoo River watershed will provide a flood warning system for downstream communities including the Kickapoo Valley Reserve.*



**Professional Grade Commercial "Real-Time" Weather Station and Sensors**

These stations use cellular modems to transmit "real-time" data every 15 minutes to be viewed remotely by users through a web browser or mobile app service. Alert notifications based on precipitation and stream levels can be created and sent via text and email.
